

Brands Britannia Race Meeting

Supplementary Regulations (Issued 25/03/26)



- The Classic Sports Car Club** will organise and promote a Race Meeting at Brands Hatch Indy Circuit on **Sunday 24th/Monday 25th May 2026**.
- The meeting will be held under the National Competition Rules 2026 of Motorsport UK (Edition 2) (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA) and these Supplementary Regulations and any written instructions the organising Club may issue for the event.
- Motorsport UK permit number: 207116 (Interclub).
The following Championship races will also take place:
Lackford Engineering Midget & Sprite Challenge: Permit No. CH2026/R076 (C)
Ramair BMW Championship: CH2026/R077 (C)
Alpha Lexis Law Firm Jaguar Championship: Permit No. CH2026/R078 (C)
- The meeting is open to all fully elected members of the organising Club and TR-Register Deutschland e.V .
- Competitors must hold a Motorsport UK race licence of Race Club or higher grade. (Please note NCR Ch. 12 App. 4 Art. 6.2) **If you have not already done so when registering, please email a copy of your 2026 race licence to info@classicsportscarclub.co.uk**
Please note that competitors holding a race licence not issued by Motorsport UK, can only participate with written authorisation from their ASN (article 2.3.7 FIA International Sporting Code).
- The Circuit is Brands Hatch Indy circuit and is 1.208 miles in length. Racing will be in a clockwise direction.
- Sign on is by digital sign on. Any competitor not digitally signed-on by 17:30 on Wednesday 20th May 2026, may be excluded. Scrutineering will be done for selected categories only, as listed within the Timetable and Final Instructions. There is no pre-event self-scrutineering.
Qualifying starts at 10:00 on Sunday 24th May and 09:00 on Monday 25th May. The meeting will open at 07.00 on both days.
Race engines must not be run before 09:15 on Sunday and 08:15 on Monday and after 18:45 on both days. Competitors not complying with this may be reported to the Clerk of the Course.

If the **same car and driver** is registered for, and entered into any additional race/s at this meeting, the entry fee for the additional (cheaper) race/s is reduced by 50%. Please note that if entering more than one race online, the online booking system is unable to automatically apply the discount, so you will need to pay full price initially. The CSCC will then refund any additional race discount to you as soon as possible, but certainly within two weeks of you booking.

- *There are two, separate Adams & Page Swinging 60s races, each with a different race format. A maximum of 14 Swinging 60s places are available on the shared grid with the Continental HTGT Challenge. For these 3 x 25 minute races, they do not have a pit-stop, however, a two driver team may take part. No winners penalties will be served or accrued in the 3 x 25 minute races.
- The Continental HTGT Challenge is a stand-alone competition administered by the CSCC and is not part of a series or championship. It is an invitational race for pre-1981 British car marques conforming to 2026 'British HTGT Competition' regulations. Drivers need to be members of TR-Register Deutschland e.V . and enter via the TR-Register.
- Class Structure and Awards are as per Championship/Series Regulations.
- The entry list opens on publication of these Supplementary Regulations and **closes on Wednesday 20th May 2026**. To encourage early entry, all entries received after Sunday 10th May 2026 will incur an additional £30 fee. This also applies to second drivers.
NO ENTRIES WILL BE CONSIDERED AFTER WEDNESDAY 20th May 2026.
Registered CSCC drivers may enter and pay online using the ProSolve booking system up until end of day on Tuesday 19th May, all other entries must be made on the official entry form and accompanied by the appropriate fee. To save administration time and costs, entries will be acknowledged by e-mail whenever possible. (See section 13, Reserves)

For your security, e-mailed entry forms (complete with signature) must not contain credit/debit card details, instead please call the office with these after e-mailing the form.

Entry will only be accepted on receipt of the fee and properly completed form. Cheques/cash are no longer accepted.

Entries will be selected to conform with (NCR Ch. 6 App. 1 Art. 10) and 1) Registered Championship/Series contenders first and 2) Entry forms received in chronological order.

13. Reserves. As per (NCR Ch. 6 App. 1 Art. 10.4) Note that entering and paying online does not mean you have a confirmed place, the online system is unable to notify you if you are a reserve or on a waiting (non-qualifying reserve) list. We will notify you within 7 days of entering if you are a reserve or on a waiting list. If you are on the waiting (non-qualifying reserve) list, you are not officially entered into the meeting and are unable to take part in the event, unless others who entered ahead of you withdraw before qualifying takes place.
14. Refunds. Entry fees will be refunded in full under the terms of (NCR Ch. 6 App. 1 Art. 11.1) if a competitor notifies the organiser in writing by email of their withdrawal by the end of the day on Sunday 10th May 2026. Any withdrawals received from Monday 11th May 2026 up until the end of the day on the closing date on Wednesday 20th May 2026, will be refunded less a £25 administration fee. There will be NO REFUNDS OR CREDITS for any withdrawals received after the closing date of Wednesday 20th May 2026, with the exception of those who are on a reserve or waiting (non-qualifying reserve) list. If you need to withdraw your entry from a race with a reserve list, we may offer you a partial or full refund, provided you immediately notify the Secretary of the Meeting that you are withdrawing and that there is a paying entry that is able to fill your place at that time.
15. The maximum number of starters will be 34 cars and the minimum will be 10. Should any of the minimum figures not be reached, the organisers have the right to either cancel the meeting or the race. They may amalgamate or split qualifying, races or classes, substitute races or move competitors as appropriate.

17. Competition Numbers must be displayed in accordance with (NCR Ch. 7 App. 10 / NCR Ch. 7 App. 13 Diagram 1 / NCR Ch. 12 App. 4 Art. 5). It is the driver's/entrant's responsibility to ensure that numbers are properly presented for scrutineering as per (NCR Ch. 12 App. 4 Art. 5.2) and are clearly visible for qualifying and race. Note that in sessions that are combined with another category, where numbers would be duplicated, cars must display the correct numbers as allocated in the digital race programme.
18. Grid positions are determined by times recorded in official qualifying, except in:
Alpha Lexis Law Firm Jaguar Championship, Ramair BMW Championship, R-Werks Special Saloons & Modsports, Gold Arts Magnificent Sevens and Lackford Engineering Midget & Sprite Challenge where the grids will be set as per Series/Championship regulations.
The combined grid consisting of Continental HTGT Challenge / Adams & Page Swinging 60's, where the qualifying session will set the grid for Race 1, the finishing positions of Race 1 & 2, will set the grids for Race 2 & 3 respectively.
Co-ordSport Tin Tops / Trackday Solutions Puma Cup will have a split, two part start as per NCR Ch. 12 App. 6 Art. 6.15. Co-ordSport Tin Tops will start ahead of the Trackday Solutions Puma Cup cars.
19. All other General Regulations of Motorsport UK apply as written.
20. Rolling starts will be used for all races. The starting signal for all races will be given by lights. In the event of any starting lights failure, the Starter will revert to the use of the National Flag.
21. Provisional results will be announced as soon as possible after each session on the CSCC electronic noticeboard at:
www.classicsportscarclub.co.uk/brandshatch
22. Protests. Entrants are reminded that protests should be made in writing in accordance with Motorsport UK (NCR Ch. 2 App. 9).
23. Admission: A single driver team will receive 4 personnel passes. If part of a two-driver team, the first driver will receive 4 personnel passes and the second driver will receive 2 personnel passes. No paddock vehicle passes are needed. No animals allowed. Please note there is another Race Meeting taking place on Saturday 23rd May, therefore no admission will be permitted to the Paddocks until those competitors have left, estimated at 19:00.
24. During qualifying, it is a competitor's responsibility to ensure that he/she completes the requisite number of laps. Some qualifying sessions may be amalgamated or split (NCR Ch. 12 App. 6 Art. 3).
25. Parc Ferme will take place as directed by officials.

26. Judges Of Fact (NCR Ch. 12 App. 3 Art. 2) will be named in the final entry list (digital event programme) for: Eligibility (Chief Scrutineer), Noise (Environmental Scrutineer) and Timing (Chief Timekeeper). Other Judges may be appointed as required, and will be detailed in Final Instructions, Entry List (digital event programme) or Bulletins.
27. Transponders will be required at this meeting as per (NCR Ch. 12 App. 6 Art. 2.2). Please make sure your number is clearly written on your registration/entry form and let us know if it changes. Transponders must be located as per manufacturers' instructions.
28. In the case of the abandonment or cancellation of races or the meeting, the organisers will retain sufficient of the entry fees in order that costs/expenses incurred shall be covered.
